Reports

Fire-Cpt Winkler reported that they are looking at wildfire mitigation currently. Station 4 firefighters are available to Walk and Talk at your property if you are interested in looking at ways to help your home be more wildfire resistant. It's been a quite month medical and house fire wise on the Avenues. There is an Avenues Fire Wise committee that will report later. Dave reiterated that it is very useful for residents to have the Fire Department come to your home to take a look. There were no questions for Cpt. Winkler

Police-Bob Norgaard reported that burglaries are down, vehicle break-ins are still up. May 16 there were shots fired near the cemetery. This was folks from outside the area who were here for unknown reasons but they were not targeting the avenues or residents. Regarding traffic noise, the equipment has been ordered and the police officers are waiting to be trained on the use of this equipment and then it will be deployed. No questions for Det. Norgaard.

City Council-Chris Wharton wished everyone a Happy Pride Month. The Pride Festival will be different this year with a march from the Capitol to Liberty Park on Sunday. Cemetery re-opening this month. Remember the Cemetery clean-up June 10, 11, 12. Budget season going well. Mayor proposing many new full time employees. Funding coming from Federal Dollars from the pandemic recovery for many positions but other will come from city budget. The question was asked about the positions funded with Federal Dollars and if those would be temporary or permanent positions. There is 3 years of funding so during that time the decision will be made if all positions are filled. Mayor's Office-Eva Lopez introduced Jamie Stokes who is currently working with district 6 and will not also join the Avenues, District 3. Jamie has been with the Mayor's Office for about 18 months. Jamie reported that the county website shows vaccination #s by zip. 59.24% of 84103 are fully vaccinated with 40% County-wide for ages 12 and up. Please take the trail survey. Jamie also reminded us that many trails are in watershed areas. Dogs and humans should not be in the water in these areas. In those areas where dogs are allowed on leash, please keep them on-leash. School Board-Katherine Kennedy reported that school board met on the 2021-22 budget and voted to not raise the tax rate. This will mean taxes will be lower this year. Even with the proposed increase in the %, taxes would have gone down. Board salaries will increase to \$12,000/year. Graduation is starting. SLC District will hold graduations at the Huntsman Center. 4 tickets/grad. Katherine reminded everyone of the robust summer school options. June 3 COVID vaccine clinic at Bryant for ages 12 and up. State Representative-Jennifer Dailey -Provost reported on the special session. Most important things: Passed resolution to accept the 1.6 million dollars coming to Utah from the Federal Government, the ARPA money. Appropriations to outline spending of this money. Fixes for mistakes during general session. Bill prohibited mask mandates in schools next year. Jen opposed this but it passed. Declared drought state of emergency. Redistricting underway. Committee (legislators) will make decision. Commission (from ballot proposition) are advisory group to the committee. Public Utilities update 5th Ave Pumphouse-Dawn Wagner capital projects manager was joined by several designers and other representatives from the city. This was their 3rd presentation on the 5th and U pump station. Will install back up generator. Dawn showed slides with information about the noise mitigation and design of the pumphouse. She responded to questions about solar and natural gas use for running the pumpstation. She addressed a question about guardrails to prevent sliding of cars into the building during snow. There were not any substantial changes to the design from the last presentation. Budget should cover increased material costs. One tree will be removed.

4th Ave Pumphouse 30 second update: Project began in October will finish at the end of June. Pump test June 2. Sampling water now. Permit to have water delivery service is in process. Landscaping will extend into July.

Elks Block Redevelopment Project-David Davis, Principal Architect South Temple and 1st Avenue. Property owned by Property Reserve, Inc. Elks building will be turned into office space. On the parking lot, apartment homes will be build. Townhomes and single story apartment. No plan for affordable housing. On 1st Ave remove one home and rework the other 6 into multiple residence homes. Elks wants height waiver. Height waiver for new apt building. Concerns primarily around seismic and energy efficiency.
