Katherine Kennedy:

I am excited to run for a second term on the Salt Lake City School Board. I grew up in Utah, attending public schools in Salt Lake City at Uintah Elementary, Clayton Middle School, and East High (On East High School!). I received an undergraduate degree from Harvard, a Ph.D. from Rutgers, and an M.A. from the University of Utah (Go Utes!). My husband and I have lived in the Avenues for more than twenty years, and we raised our four children here. Our older children graduated from West High in 2013 and 2016, and our younger two are enrolled in the West High Classes of 2019 and 2021 (Once a Panther, Always a Panther!). I volunteered thousands of hours in our schools and on school and district committees before running for a seat on the school board four years ago.

As a school board member, my goal is to put students and teachers first.

I believe that school board members must be concerned about the education of every student in our district so our students can lead successful lives. As a strong advocate for an equitable education for all students, I have worked hard to bolster every Salt Lake City public school, including Bryant Middle School. I advocated for benefits for our preschool teachers, which resulted in a better quality of life and higher retention rates. I also support K-12 teacher retention programs, such as SLCS's acclaimed Peer Review (PAR) program. I support transparent decision making at every level in our school system.

During each legislative session, I speak with our representatives about education-related issues, including school funding. I was elected by my board peers as vice president in 2017, and I continue to serve in that role today. I regularly attend the School Community Council meetings at all our Avenues elementary schools and at West High as well as the Greater Avenues Community Council and Capitol Hill Neighborhood Council meetings.

We are looking and working together for what needs to change so all students benefit in all schools. The more we work together, the greater the outcome for every student.

I will bridge the gaps in communication, resources and relationships by using my combined experience in schools and nonprofit organizations. The gap can - and will - become smaller as we work together on the focus of student success! Our greatest strength is knowing that helping one child helps all children. The action that supports the student is always the right way. It is when we lose sight of the student because of the walls of the organization that we lose the child.

Working together, with a single focus of actions, attitudes and resources on the student is where we will find success. We do not need uniformity in schools. Baseball has completed another successful spring season at Lindsey Gardens Park! Congratulations to the *Avenues Aces* and *Avenues Vulcans* for winning City championships, and to the *Avenues Zombies* and *Avenues Panthers* for being runners-up! In addition to playing a lot of great ball, Avenues Baseball contributed to our community: Each of our 16 teams with a total of 180 players selected a service project to improve Lindsey Gardens, and parents, players and coaches put in more than 200 hours of work on this shared community resource.

Between the two events, Avenues Baseball raised more than \$9,000, which we intend to contribute to Salt Lake City to make improvements to Lindsey Gardens Park. Our immediate goals are to fund upgrades to the park's Upper Field, including new fencing, storage and baseball practice amenities. Our league has also submitted, with the approval of the GACC, a Capital Improvement Program Proposal to improve the walkability of Lindsey Gardens and to build a new snack shack. On July 11, representatives from **Salt Lake City Department of Public Utilities** will provide updates to the Avenues Community on various current projects, including:

Street Lighting - upgrading all of our streetlights to LED technology. We have completed more than 60% of our conversions. Our initial efforts focused on the arterial and collector streets, then downtown lights. Our next areas of focus will be the neighborhoods, after updating our Street Lighting Master Plan. We will choose a consultant next week and task them with substantial public outreach efforts, along with our Department’s public engagement manager and Mayor’s Office liaisons. We are committed to hearing what our neighborhoods have to say about street lighting, and to also fully inform residents and businesses about our plans and goals. The Street Lighting Master Plan will guide us in moving forward into the neighborhoods and will inform effective public policy on this issue.

4th Avenue Well Project: Design is underway for a substantial update to a Public Utilities well at 4th Avenue and Canyon Road. This well is a workhorse, one of the most productive in our network. It provides about 6 million gallons of drinking water per day to downtown SLC in high-demand summer months. Without this well, water pressure would drop and the distribution system would struggle to meet demand. Recent inspections have determined the well is deficient in some updated state requirements and is a risk to our employees’ safety. To correct these issues, we must make improvements. This will require all equipment at the site (currently operating underground) be moved to an above-ground structure. This project involves design and construction of a well housing

structure on the site of the existing well. We are in the earliest stages of the above-ground well design. The contractor is Bowen Collins & Associates, a firm we have worked with on many successful drinking water system designs. We are also engaging with planners in Salt Lake City Corp. We know this is a historic district and we are dedicated to working with nearby community councils and the Historic Landmark Commission in designing a structure that supports community aesthetics as well as operational needs. SLC Public Utilities and Bowen Collins representatives will attend on July 11 to further explain the project and to answer questions. We welcome your discussion and contributions.

Salt Lake City Canyon Watershed Protection Efforts - The City's Watershed Management Plan will be discussed.

Water Conservation Programming Update - The City is currently operating under Phase 1 of our Water Shortage Contingency Plan, designated in April by Mayor Biskupski. This is a voluntary and educational step. We are urging residents and businesses to be mindful about water use this summer and to practice conservation whenever possible. Snowpack and stream runoff were lower than normal this year, though we do have adequate water for the season stored in our reservoirs.

EATING SMART WHILE TRAVELING AND ON VACATION

Eating healthy in the summer can be a challenge. Many of us have vacations coming up, from family road trips to flying to faraway destinations. The healthy food habits you’ve created at home may be disrupted as you face travel time and unfamiliar places. You may also be vacationing with friends or family who have good intentions, but push sweet treats or less healthy foods your way.

Tips for eating healthy while traveling

- **Plan ahead:** Whenever possible, bring your own snacks and easy meal items. Pack travel-friendly snacks, such as unsalted nuts, applesauce cups, whole fresh fruit, single serving nut butters, and whole-grain crackers. If you have a small cooler, you could also pack string cheese, single-serve hummus, veggies, or Greek yogurt.
- **Choose wisely when eating out:** Scope out the restaurant menu ahead of time and look for options that contain fruits

and vegetables. Choose to drink water or milk instead of soda. Avoid breaded items, opting instead for grilled or baked options with sauces on the side. Keep in mind many restaurants will fill your plate with big portion sizes. Take your time eating and chewing your food — stopping periodically to determine if you’re full and at a good stopping point.

- **Eat mindfully.** Studies have found that the first bites of food have a stronger taste and sensation. So, if you want to try your aunt’s favorite cake recipe, choose a smaller portion and savor each bite.
- **Know your “why.”** If you know that less healthy food will be readily available where you’re staying, remind yourself why eating healthy is important to you. Perhaps it’s a healthy lifestyle you want to maintain. Or the reason might be having more energy, feeling good about yourself, or being an example for your kids.
