**July 23rd:** Mail ballots should have been sent to voters. Follow the enclosed directions and mail it back. It MUST be postmarked by August 12th to be counted.

July 30th: In-person early voting begins at Salt Lake County Government Center 2001 S. State Street; south building.

August 6th: Last day to request a mail ballot. Also it is the last day to register to vote either online or at the county clerk's office.

August 9th: In-person early voting ends.

August 13th: Municipal Primary Election Day. Voters may still register to vote with a provisional ballot at a polling location. Voters may drop off their vote-by-mail ballot at a Vote Center during polling hours (7:00 am – 8:00 pm).

# Salt Lake City Urban Forest

A basic summary of the Salt Lake City's Urban Forestry Division: Salt Lake City's current urban forest inventory contains approximately 86,000 trees and more than 36,000 vacant planting sites (located in city parks, on city facility properties, and along city streets and trails). Collectively the City's trees form a vast living infrastructure that serves to moderate urban temperatures, helps clean our air, buffers city noise and light pollution, reduces energy consumption, promotes healthy recreation, and increases property values. Because tree are so valuable, the city's significant number of viable vacant planting sites represent an outstanding potential to develop a larger, more beneficial, urban forest canopy for the City's residents and visitors.

Tasked with sustaining and growing Salt Lake City's tree canopy, the Urban Forestry Division applies administrative and operational resources to fulfill the following responsibilities: Servicing of Public Requests, Permit Plan Review and Construction Site Inspection, Emergency Response, Tree Pruning, Tree and Stump Removal, Tree Planting, Insect and Disease Abatement, Inventory and Database Management and coordinating public engagement and education.

As Salt Lake City grows, a healthy and growing urban forest will be integral to the livability and quality of life for its residents. Recognizing that city's residents have a profound impact on the quality, safety, and health of a city's trees, the Urban Forestry Division is committed to providing services and programs that encourage active community participation in nurturing Salt Lake City's treasured trees.

In our April issue of the Agenda there was an article about the Great Utah Shake Out, CERT and Be Ready Utah. There are four CERT courses taught each year in the Public Safety Building. Two of our Avenues residents completed CERT training in June. They were awarded their CERT Kit and their Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) recognized certificate of completion. Jenn said that it was a very interesting course that she felt was well worth her time and effort. The \$30 cost of the class covers a manual plus the kit. The GACC will reimburse the course fee for any Avenues resident who completes the course. Send me a copy of your certificate of completion and we'll send you a \$30 check. 

# The Kathryn F. Kirk Center for Comprehensive Cancer Care and Women's Cancers

The Kathryn F. Kirk Center is Phase 5 of the Huntsman Cancer Center Expansion plans. It is a \$219 million, 200,000-square foot building that will have additional clinical and faculty offices. There will be an expanded wellness and integrated health center plus two floors available for future build-out based on cancer patient needs. It is scheduled to begin construction in 2019 and be open to patients in 2022. Shawn Wood, University of Utah Communications Specialist, will be at the August GACC General meeting to talk about the expansion and how the construction will affect traffic in the University Medical Campus.

# Update on the Project at the 4th Avenue Well in City Creek Park

The first week of June was tumultuous, with the City Council members unanimously placing contingencies on the funding for the project, the GACC membership voting almost unanimously, and SLC Public Utilities asking to postpone the hearing at the Landmarks Commission. We could not have predicted these events and are indebted to Council Member Chris Wharton and the other Council members for hitting the "pause" button.

Here's what we know now. First, the project will not begin construction this fall. The well will continue to operate through the warmer months in 2019 and 2020. Second, Salt Lake City Public Utilities will present two additional designs to the City Council. Third, while the nature of the public process and the timeline are not defined yet, there will be an opportunity for public comment on the new designs.

# 12 Small Cell Pole Locations Approved for the Avenues

In mid-July I received a call from Cathy, a 16th Avenue resident, who was told by a crew that was marking her property for digging, that the next week she would have a 26' pole installed in front of her window. WHAT?

I called Chris Norlem, Construction Program Manager for the City. He told me that there are currently 12 small cell pole locations approved in the rights-of-way in the Avenues residential area. In accordance with the new federal law governing wireless high speed internet, Salt Lake City is obliged to permit small cell pole installations in the public right-of-way. However, the City requires that they be placed on the property line to make it less obtrusive.

Each pole will have a 7-inch diameter with a few attachments, similar to a street light pole and narrower than a Rocky Mountain Power pole. So that is what's happening if they come to your house.

# Imagine a Hybrid of Uber and a City Bus System

UTA is launching a different type of 'microtransit' that is a cross between Uber or Lyft and traditional bus service. It is a bit like Uber or Lyft where you to hail a ride for a specific destination and receive and estimated time to be picked up. But it is also like traditional bus service where the fare is a set amount no matter the distance. Transfers would be allowed between 'microtransit' and regular buses and trains.

Blake Perez, Transportation Planner for the Department of Community and Neighborhoods, is coming to our August GACC General Meeting to share all the details about this exciting concept. UTA chose to try it first in southwestern Salt Lake County. This new hybrid system will become reality within weeks in our area.

# 9 TIPS FOR A SAFE GRILLING SEASON

An average of 19,000 patients in the US, go to the emergency room for grilling related incidents yearly. Here are a few tips to help you enjoy the grilling season without a visit to our Emergency Department.

# 1. Put your grill in a safe location

Place your grill at least 10 feet from your house. Never place it under overhangs or near trees, tablecloths, lawn decorations, or other items that could potentially catch fire. Setup your grill on a flat, level surface.

# 2. Clean your grill regularly

Clean your grill before each use. You'll want to clean away grease and other buildup that can cause flare-ups and add fuel to potential fires.

## 3. Check your grill for problems

It's not uncommon for grills to develop propane leaks or similar problems. Check all gas lines, and place a little bit of soap water on potential problem spots to check for leaks. If you have a gas leak, it's time to fix or replace your grill.

### 4. Wear the right gear

Long sleeves and grilling gloves can protect your arms and hands from the heat of the fire. However, you don't want to wear loose clothing while grilling. It can easily catch on fire. If you have long hair, wear it up and out of the way.

### 5. Be ready to put out a fire

Baking soda is a good option for putting out a grease fire. You can also use a fire extinguisher. Make sure you know how to use it and that it's in working order. If you can't get your fire out, don't hesitate to call 911 for help.

### 6. Use caution when using lighter fluid

Only use lighter fluid to start the charcoal on fire and use it sparingly. Never add lighter fluid to a grill that's been lighted and is doing well.

#### Don't turn on the gas while the grill is closed

Always open up the lid so the propane can dissipate on your grill before you light it.

### 8. Never leave a grill unattended

Once you start the grill, make sure you can be around to finish the cooking. And remember to keep kids and pets away from the grill. It might seem like common sense, but young kids or pets can get injured easily on a hot grill.

### 9. Use a meat thermometer

Most grilling involves meat. If your grill is running hot, it's easy to burn the outside of your meat without actually reaching the right temperatures inside your meat. A meat thermometer is a good way to get around this.
